Eva is a Professor of the Danish School of Education at Aarhus University in Denmark. Eva uses the theories of Norbert Elias to examine the place of children, especially young children, in the institutional settings of society as well as in national projects of the state. Her work also addresses the use and socialization of legitimate emotions, the dominant role of education, inter-ethnic relations among young children as well as relations between established and outsiders in rural areas. Among her publication are *Children of the Welfare State: Civilising Practices in Schools, Childcare and Families* (Pluto Press, 2017) co-authored with Laura Gilliam, a book also presenting an introduction to and discussion of Elias concept of 'civilizing' and the co-edited (with Karen Fog Olwig) *Children's Places: Cross-Cultural Perspectives* (Routledge, 2003). Her work has also been published in the *Journal of Ethnic and Migration Studies*, *Anthropology in Action*, *Childhood*, *Human Figurations* amongst others.
